




FREE Scrapbooking make-and-take and author event with Joanna Slan



Janisse Ray, author, poet and environmental activist, looks at life in rural southern Georgia in her blend of memoir and nature study. She grew up in a junkyard at the edge of a longleaf pine forest. In her books, she combines her love of "cracker culture," ecology, and her personal history. Two of her books have been named to the list of "25 Books Every Georgian Should Read." She has two new books coming out this year and will debut some of them with us.

In addition to supporting the technical needs of the Library, Friends are sponsoring an Angel Wall this year. We will have suggested book, CD and DVD titles there. Items can be purchased for the library in honor or memory of that special loved one. Cleopatra Mathis has published six books of poems. Her work has appeared widely, including *The New Yorker*, *Poetry*, *American Poetry Review*, *Tri-Quarterly*, *The Southern Review*, and *The Georgia Review*. Prizes for her work include two National Endowment for the Arts grants; the Jane Kenyon Award for Outstanding Book of Poems; two Pushcart Prizes; and The Robert Frost Resident Poet Award. She is the Frederick Sessions Beebe Professor of the Art of Writing at Dartmouth College.
